

21st Century Project MOVE Narrative of Strategies

The 21st Century Community Learning Project MOVE program at Dr. William A. Chapman Elementary School is designed to provide lessons for students in Grades 2-5, to accelerate learning all the while making learning fun. Students have been selected based on a variety of data. Certified teachers provide a curriculum rich environment in Reading and Math, where lessons are developed by certified Instructional Coaches. These lessons are aligned to the Standards and have been strategically compiled based on students' individual instructional needs.

In addition, students are provided with daily snacks and are given time to complete their Home Learning assignments. As an extension to our Magnet STEAM program, students have the opportunity to participate in STEAM activities during Project MOVE throughout the week.

All students (from the school and any surrounding private or charter school) are invited to attend the program. Flyers are sent to all parents of students at the school. In addition, all neighboring private and charter schools are given copies of the flyer to distribute to their students/parents. Program flyers are posted on the schools' website as well as are available in the school's main office.

Once students have been selected, the program director meets with parents periodically to discuss program implementation and progress. Parents also receive an expectation letter at the beginning of the school year, delineating attendance, behavior, and academic expectations for the students. They are also given reminder notes every quarter.
